### ElectronicBrains.com Adds Affordable Web Hosting Service

(Valdese, NC) - Less than two months after creating an online business website, Valdese entrepreneur Joseph Ellis was faced with a decision - pay major bucks to upgrade the business web account, or go into the web hosting business himself. "I had three websites I was maintaining and two of them starting going over their monthly allotted bandwidth limit," remarked Ellis. "This was after I had already upgraded both accounts in previous months for the same reason - they were getting too popular!" Rather than forking out ever-increasing monthly fees, Ellis decided to take the plunge and start web hosting. "I'm offering this service at a very competitive price - **\$4.99/month** for the basic package," Ellis continued.

While Mr. Ellis can create websites for customers, it isn't something he is actively seeking to do. "Our customers have a great deal of technical options with these accounts. They can set up their own e-mail accounts and web page settings by using a very intuitive control panel that is loaded when they login," Ellis explained. "They can use any web development software they want to - including Microsoft's popular FrontPage 2000. Our accounts include FrontPage Extensions, at no added cost to the customer."

VolcanoHost.com has also added domain registration to their line of services. This service can be found at [www.DomainOfficials.com](http://www.DomainOfficials.com). "The big domain registrars charge \$35 / year for a domain registration. Our prices start at just \$8.95 / year for a 1-year registration. Unlike other web hosting companies like Yahoo/GeoCities, DomainOfficials.com doesn't try to control the customer's domain name. "Anyone who has ever tried to transfer a domain from a GeoCities account knows what a hassle that can be. Their technical support took about two months before they ever gave me the registry key so I could transfer my domain name," Ellis complained. "In the meantime, I was stuck paying their monthly fees. You can see there wasn't much of an incentive for them to give me a prompt response. We strongly encourage our customers to do the domain registration themselves, so *they* will be in charge of their domain - not us."

VolcanoHost.com is also working with the popular online payment company PayPal, to handle the automated monthly or annual payments. Customers can set up their accounts on PayPal to have the fees deducted from their credit cards or bank accounts. There is no charge to the customer for this service - PayPal takes a small percentage out of the payments before paying VolcanoHost.com. This is also a totally secure system.
